

introduction and why its different this time (maybe)

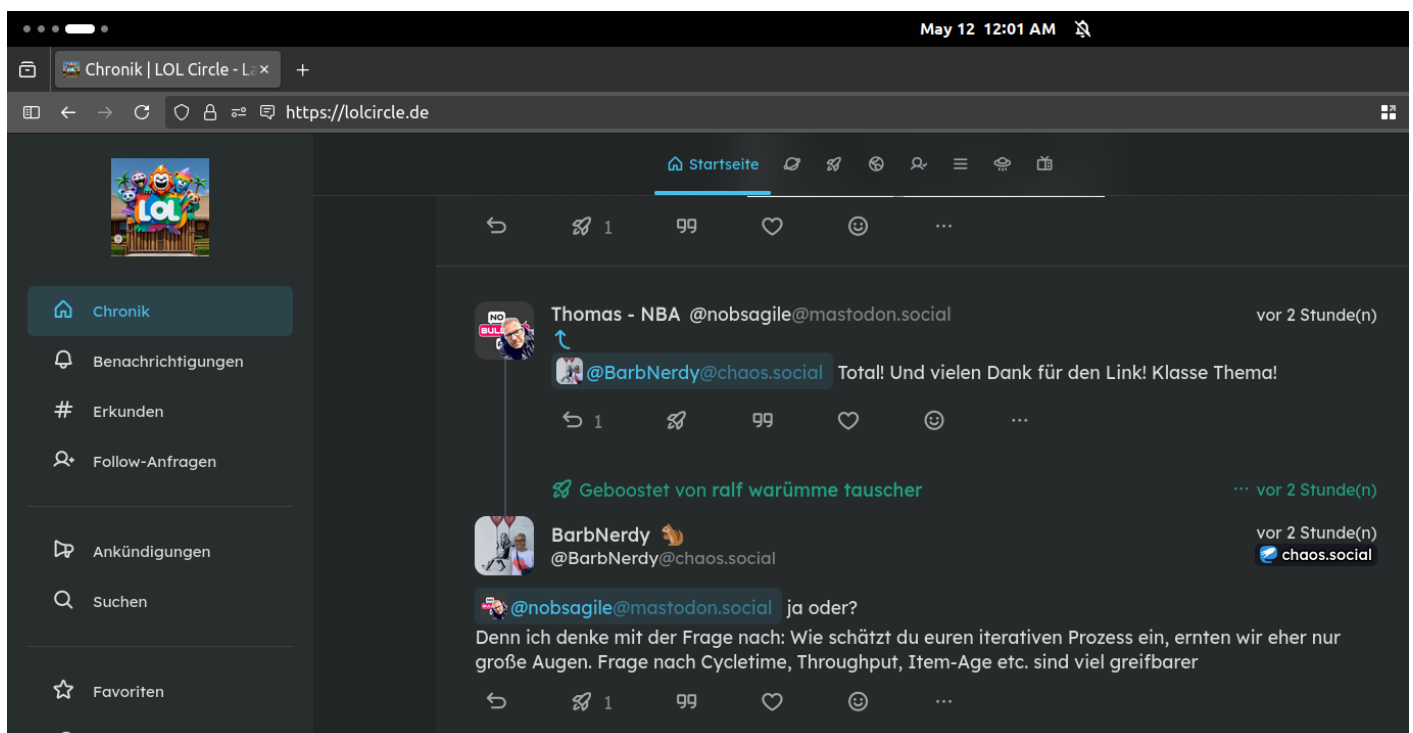

different goals lead to two distinct solutions.

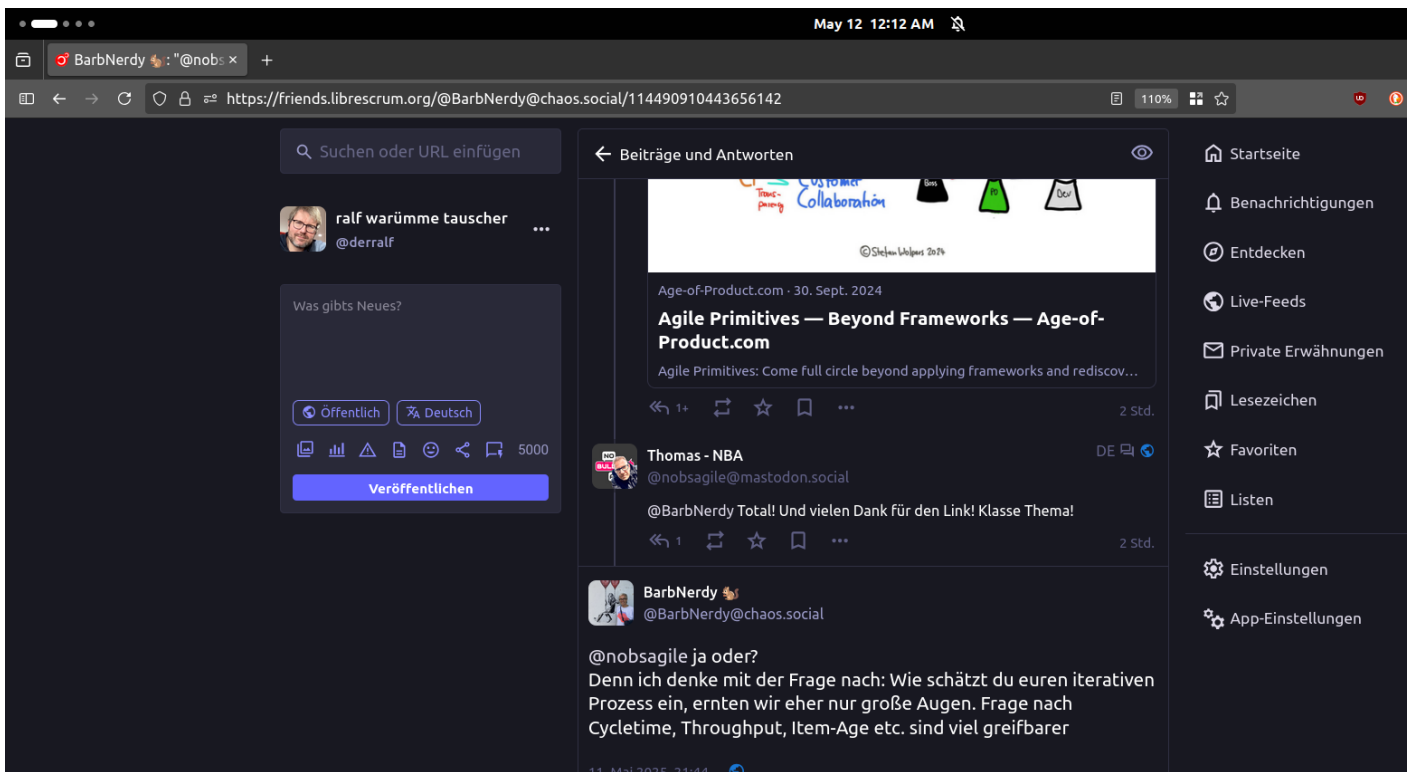

with one single click you are able to follow all people of the agile starter pack with your mastodon account here:

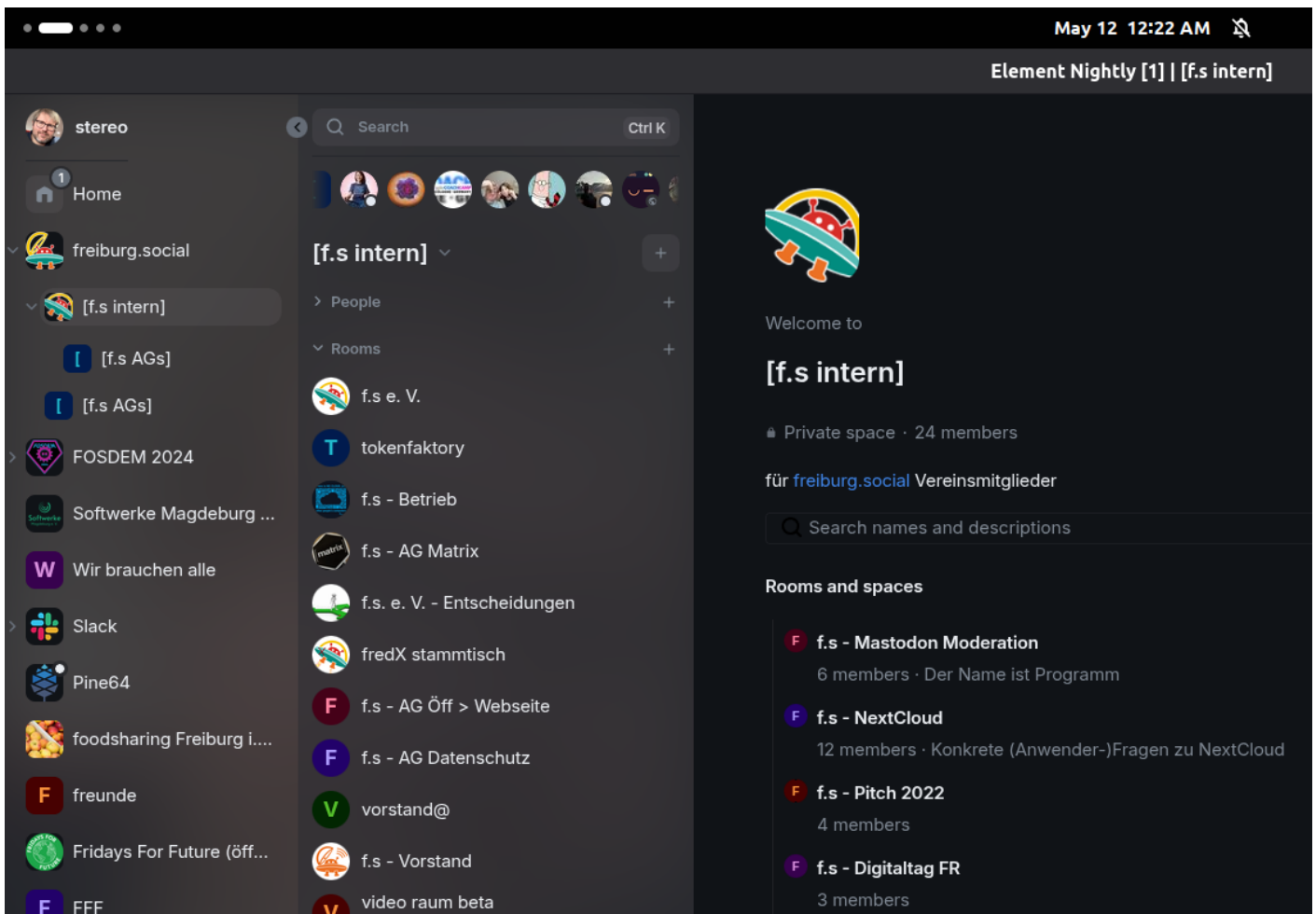
